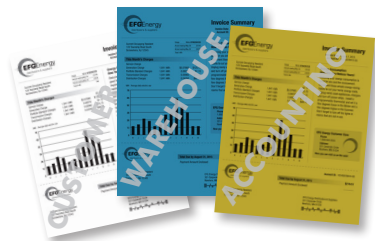

Make carbon copies without added costs

Looking to make multiple copies of the same print data, without the hefty price tag of dot matrix carbon copy printing?

At Brother, we understand this type of printing can be expensive due to high supply costs, aging technology, and high-maintenance contracts. We offer an alternative option with printers and MFPs that have the ability to print multiple copies of the same print data via our PCL driver by loading different color or paper types into the paper trays.



It's similar to the carbon paper printing process, but without the added costs. In fact, the Brother Workhorse monochrome laser printers and MFPs offer a low-cost printing alternative and access to the Brother Value Print Program (VPP) for discounts on Brother Genuine Supplies.

After customizing your preferences, send a single document and print three copies in three different colors.

For instance, load:

Tray 1 Standard white paper for the customer invoice,

Tray 2 blue paper for the warehouse copy, and

Tray 3 yellow paper for the accounting copy.

You can set unique watermarks for different colors that identify who they are for.



How it works

Individual paper trays are pre-loaded with different colors or paper types. If you enable carbon copy printing, the machine will make copies automatically.
